III. Rights of the data subjects

Data subjects have the right to request ECDC access to and rectification and erasure of personal data. They have the right to request restriction of processing concerning their personal data, to object to the processing and the right to data portability.

Data subjects have a right to lodge a complaint to the European Data Protection Supervisor in case they consider that their data is processed in breach of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725.

In some cases restrictions under Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 may apply.
